The analysis revealed that 94.18% of subjects fall under Grades A and B, indicating high levels of student satisfaction and effective teaching-</p>  |

For the academic year 2025–2026, the respective Schools and units have prepared and submitted their reports, reflecting their readiness for ranking and accreditation processes.</p>  |
|   | <p><b>Review of the adoption of the latest tools and technologies</b></p>                                      | <p>A comprehensive review of the adoption of the latest tools and technologies was carried out, with a detailed analysis of digital learning initiatives, certification programs, and skill development activities. For the academic year 2025–2026, it was reported that approximately 6,800 students successfully completed over 1 lakh certifications through MOOC platforms. These courses were curated and customized to align with current industry requirements, thereby enhancing employability and workforce readiness.</p>   |
|   | <p><b>Research Paper Publication/Patents/ Funded Projects</b></p>  | <p>A comprehensive review of research paper publications, patents, funded projects, and consultancy activities was carried out, with a detailed analysis of research productivity and innovation outcomes. For the academic year 2025–2026, it was reported that faculty and researchers of SoE and SoC published 1,058 research papers in peer-reviewed journals and conferences, all indexed in Scopus, and with several also indexed in Web of Science. A total of 154 patents were published in 2025, reflecting strong innovation output. In addition, one government-funded research project worth ₹12.6 lakhs is currently in progress. For the academic year 2025-2026, it was reported that a significant number of students successfully completed internship-based projects in collaboration with reputed industries and organizations. These initiatives have enhanced practical exposure, industry-relevant skills, and employability, reflecting strong integration of academic learning with real-world applications across departments.</p> |

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


















